

PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear workers towards justice and peace!

"Love and faithfulness meet together;

justice and peace kiss each other." (Psalm 85:10)

Whenever I hear this verse, I think of Gustav Klimt's "The Kiss". Not sure why, to be honest. Maybe, because it's one of my favorite paintings (and I got to see the original in Vienna). And maybe, because that verse is one of favorite sentences from the Bible. It expresses my deepest hope and desire that one day, one hopefully not too distant day, there will be justice and peace in this world. That one day "Faithfulness springs forth from the earth, and justice looks down from heaven. 12 The LORD will indeed give what is good, and our land will yield its harvest. 13 Justice goes before him and prepares the way for his steps." (85:11-13)

Now, if you are an overachiever and just got out your bible to check whether I used the right translation, you will have noticed a slight difference. While all the common English versions talk about "righteousness", I translated "justice". Not because I want to change the bible, don't worry. But because I want you to hear what the Hebrew word tzedakah actually means here in our today's concept.

"Tzedakah is seen as a form of social justice [...]. It cannot be done to someone — rather, it must be done with someone." Tzedakah does not mean patronizing help, but real work towards social justice.

And what about peace in the Hebrew Bible? In English, 'peace' is generally used to mean an absence of (or freedom from) conflict. However, *peace* (*shalom*) is deeper than this freedom from conflict – it also involves people living in good relationships with those around them, with creation and with God. Experiencing *shalom* means experiencing balance, well-being, wholeness, prosperity, security and justice. No justice, no peace. It's the most biblical chant during protests. I love it. Peace, like justice, is an act. We are required to do justice and to make peace. As long as there is no justice and peace for all we are required to act. And we at Christ the King do.

FIRE REPAIRS/GAS LINE REPLACEMENT UPDATE

The good news this month is that the gas line repairs have been inspected and approved by the City, completed by the contractor and will be released by PG&E on August 3rd. The paving contractor was able to backfill and cap the trench with concrete so no more cones in the parking lot! Minor cleanup is still needed.

As for the fire repairs, rough framing, sheer wall and roof sheeting passed City inspection. The windows are currently being installed. The exterior door has arrived as well and will be scheduled for installation soon. The exterior water proofing membrane is next on the list. Additional plans need to be submitted to the City for the electrical and mechanical improvements concurrent with the work being performed. Still aiming for November completion.

Speaking of volunteering, we have been very fortunate at Christ the King to have had a very talented individual share his musical gifts with us. **Jason Tiller** has been not only an inspiration for our choir but also has served as handbell musician, soloist, cantor and Musical/Sound Tech Extraordinaire in the age of Zoom. I asked Jason to share with us a bit about his background:



I am the son of church musicians. I have memories of being in the car as my mother drove through a snowstorm in the Pennsylvania panhandle to conduct Christmas Eve services as well as memories of crawling around on the organ pedals while my dad was practicing. It was natural that I also wanted to be a musician, but after high school I was seduced by the siren call of algorithms and programming a computer to bend it to my will. Although I've earned my keep as a computer programmer ever since graduating from college, music has always been part of my life. While I was in high school, I fell in love with handbell ringing, with its unique blend of athleticism, dexterity, and musicality. I owe much of my life to handbells - I met my wife through bells, decided to leave L.A.

and move up to the Bay Area because of bells, and I've traveled all over the world... because of bells. But as my mother, a consummate singer, slowly lost herself to Alzheimer's, I realized I wanted a deeper connection to music than provided by a percussion instrument like bells, and thus I took up singing. I love the feeling of turning breath into vibrations into words into music. I know I will never through voice revisit the heights I achieved on handbells, but I hope that through my singing I can still bring beauty into the world. **– Jason Tiller**
