Council President's Corner

CTK's Annual Congregation Meeting was held on December 6th via Zoom – another first for us! Thirty-four members were in attendance at the meeting. Debbie Ward and Jim Sepeda were voted in as new Council members for 2021 and I will continue on Council for a second term. The Council will be installed during the 1/10 worship service and the positions of President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer will be voted on by the Council members at the 1/12 Council meeting. The congregation adopted a balanced budget (\$223,361) for fiscal year 2021 as proposed and recommended by Council.

A copy of the Annual Report highlighting the past year's activities and accomplishments as well as the budget was distributed to all members of the Congregation prior to the meeting via e-mail. If you have not already done so, I would encourage you to read the report. While we have been significantly impacted by the fire of last year as well as coronavirus, it still is amazing what has been accomplished and improvements made as we continue to move forward. Thanks to the many who give of their time as well as financial donations so that we can continue in service.

We also want to especially thank outgoing Council members Bob Kufeld and Melinda Kufeld for their service on Council and their continuing service to CTK moving forward on various committees, ministries and other volunteer efforts. They have been an inspiration!

January is a time of new beginnings: the fire repair construction is anticipated to be complete by the end of January/mid-February. The insulation inspection will be this next week followed by drywall installation. We can start the replacement of office furnishings damaged or destroyed by the fire and unpacking (and debulking!) of the storage containers that have become a fixture in the CTK parking lot this past year. We are also are looking to remove the temporary sheds adjacent to our back-property line and resurfacing the parking lot during summer. We will continue to strengthen relationships with our neighbor ELCA churches, Bethesda and the community through our ministries.

And, we look forward to Pastor Tia's installation as CTK's Pastor in 2021, in the newly repaired sanctuary when we are able to meet and worship in person safely once again!
