Dear Saints of Christ the King!

"Doubtless God could have made a better berry, but doubtless God never did." (Dr. William Butler, 17th Century English Writer)<sup>1</sup>

I fully agree. Doubtless God didn't make a better berry. (Sorry, raspberry, currant, blackberry...). One of my best times in my life was when I lived on a farm in Manitoba, Canada. My host-parents mostly had large fields of broccoli and carrots. And then there were some strawberry fields behind our house. I was in paradise.

Paradise fits the notion that strawberries are pretty churchy. It's the berry connotated with Mary, Mother of God. Why? Because it blossoms in May, which traditionally is the month of Mary. Because the berry is heart-shaped and red like love. Legend has it that if you break a double strawberry


