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PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Saints!

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

The other day someone approached me after our worship service and said: "Pastor, I think it's time to reintroduce the passing of the peace again." It's one of the liturgical elements that was omitted when the pandemic hit at first. On Zoom we then adapted it into breakout-rooms where people shared about a question. Those 6 minutes every Sunday helped us build and strengthen relationships within our community and nurtured a sense of belonging.

Now, we are back in the sanctuary, with the majority joining us in-person and a stable number watching via Zoom. Breakout-rooms aren't a good option anymore. So, the sharing of the peace should be back, right? Which made me revisit why we do it in the first place. And no, it's not to check-in with each other and to share the latest news on your kids and grandkids. Even though, that's important, too. The sign of peace is not simply a public, large breakout-room where people observe closely whom the pastor and greets. And whom not. Where we learn about

each other's health, sorrows and happiness. It's not an in-church coffee-hour before we get together for the wine. It's not about fellowship even. So, what is it about?



Within the liturgy it's located somewhere after the prayer of the people and before sharing bread and wine at the table of the Lord. It's an act of reconciliation after we heard about the example of Jesus Christ and the saints and before we share the body and blood of Christ as the body of Christ. It's an act of feeding our souls through reconciliation and eye-contact. Knowing that it's not our own peace we offer. But God's.

"So, when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to you brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift" (Matthew 5:23-24)

Right, so, it's not about shaking hands or bumping elbows with everyone in church. It's about looking the people in the eye that you might hold a grudge against. The one that you aren't sure is doing God's work in this world exactly how you would like it to be done. The one you haven't talked to for a while. The one you might overlook at times.

And, it's the greeting the risen Christ used to say "Hi" to his friends and make sure they got an idea of who he was. Especially, when he didn't knock at the door and just stood in the middle of the room. And said: "Peace be with you." (John 20,19) Imagine a world, where that was the way to acknowledge and greet each other.

Dear Saints, Peace be with you during this Easter Season! Peace be with our world!

Alan, Jim and pastor Tia have been finalizing the MOU and a liability waiver for CTK to be signed by the participants of the program. Both happened in collaboration with the City of Fremont and our layer Fred. Council approved both documents and authorized our president Jim to sign them on behalf of CTK.

Meanwhile, we attend bi-weekly Zoom calls with representatives from the City of Fremont and from other participating churches. It's a great community offering support and insights and help! Cam Bauer started

spearheading a group inviting neighbors to join our hospitality efforts during the month of June, when we will potentially be hosting.

It's amazing to see so many of us rally around this work.

On April 26th and May 25th we hosted a zoom call with **neighbors** who had expressed interest in supporting the program in different ways. Seven joined us in April!! It was a great, productive, mutually respectful meeting. God's at work! Now, we are trying to work out **hospitality** efforts. What we learned from the other host sites is that there are 3 main needs: gas cards, Target cards and time to connect as people. CHOIR CONCERT AT CTK


