AUGUST SAFE PARKING WRAPS UP

For August Christ the King again hosted Safe Parking. The participants continue to be very appreciative of the safe environment we provide. We again handed out snacks and drinks and some volunteers provided morning coffee, always a favorite. Jesus & Justice Collective representatives provided food one evening, including lots of fruits and vegetables.

Thanks to your donations (!) we were able to hand out a round of Grocery Outlet cards. Thanks to a CTK family we distributed packing blankets which the participants use to keep their vehicles a little less chilly at night.

There were more participants than in June. August started and ended with 10 vehicles and 12 participants. Twice there were 12 vehicles and 15 participants, the highest numbers, and 8 times there were 13 or more participants (10 to 12 vehicles). Over the course of the month, cumulatively, there were 15 vehicles and 18 participants, 6 of whom were new to CTK. As for volunteers, Fremont Lutherans covered most of the shifts but there were more non-Lutherans this month.

The bumps were less significant than in June, partly because we did more to keep things locked. Early in the month, during the day, someone stole a fire extinguisher and portable toilet lock. Late in the month, twice, someone stole one of the two toilet locks while they were unlocked at night. There were zero problems with the participants.

Christ the King's next turn to host the program will be in December. If you have questions about the program, please contact Alan, Jim or Bunny.


